The Hong Kong Post Office Royal Arms - A Survey

Hong Kong Island was formally taken possession of for the purposes of a trade station on 28 January 1841 by Captain Charles Elliot, R.N. as Chief Superintendent of Trade for the British Subjects in China. His aide Mr. A.R. Johnston, the Second Superintendent of Trade who was with the government of Hong Kong wrote to the Secretary of the Governor General of India on 24 August 1841 that he had made regulations for a Post Office to be set up. He appointed Mr. F.G. Fitzgibbon to be the Clerk in Charge of the Post Office.

In April 1842, Mr. Robert Edwards was appointed to take charge of the Post Office but he was never given the title of Postmaster. His duty was to co-operate with the Harbour Master in handling of mails in and out of Hong Kong¹. The regulations of the Post Office were published on 15 April 1842: -

All mails upon arrival are to be delivered to the Harbour Master, who will have them conveyed to the Post Office. Notice of the intended time for closing any mail is to be given to the Harbour Master who will make the necessary arrangements for having it taken on board ship. The Harbour Master is to be given information to Mr. Edwards of the arrivals, sailings and general movements of the vessels in port, who will cause a notice of the same to be exposed at the Post Office. A general delivery of letters to take place at least once in every twenty-four hours. All Government letters are to be forwarded immediately on arrival. The office to be kept open and attended from 8 o'clock a.m. For the present no charge of any description to be made on letters and parcels.

Presumably from then on, the Royal Arms Hong Kong Post Office cachet was taken into use in lieu of the local made single-ring Post Office Hong Kong 1841 which gave no indication of sovereignty (Fig.1 & 2). Although not present in the London G.P.O. proof book, the Royal Arms Hong Kong Post Office cachet being a government seal must surely originated from England and seals of similar design also exist such as the *Superintendents of British Trade in China* seal used by Capt. Elliot's deputy Mr. A. R. Johnston on confiscated opium receipt in Macao 1939. (Fig.3)

The Hong Kong Post Office Royal Arms cachet was used as a departure, arrival and as well as a transit mark. Out of the 74 letters that I have recorded, one can see that the majorities were addressed to England or India since they were written by military personnel serving with the China Expedition Force. Two big correspondence, in particular the Edwards correspondence to Ceylon and Weston Super Mare and the recent Captain Bruce correspondence to Ireland contained many examples of the Royal Arms covers throughout the period of usage. Covers sent to England often bear the Bombay oval INDIA or the rectangular Calcutta INDIA transit mark in black or red since they were sent by private or H.M.S. ships from the Far East to India where they were trans-shipped to either East India vessels or P & O ships to continue their westward journey. In addition to the "India" markings, a boxed *Postage/ Inward Bearing Ans / Outward do.*. Hammond Giles type Bombay SR5 are found on sixteen of the Royal Arms covers between April to December 1843. Detail discussion of the origin and usage of this Indian marking is beyond the scope of this article. Readers interested can consult Lee Scamp's masterpiece² "Postal Rate History of China & Hong Kong" and Derek Hammond Giles article³ on this subject.

The incoming letters bearing the Royal Arms were mostly originated from the U.S. Forbes and Augustine Heard correspondences. There are few letters recorded to France, Siam, Batavia, U.S.A. and only one letter recorded to Italy via England also bearing a British "Detained for Postage" cachet.

The earliest recorded date of use of the Hong Kong Post Office Royal Arms is 20 June 1842 on an entire-letter addressed to E.J.B. Clarke of Cheshunt, England. The letter bears the inscription *China Expedition* which indicates that it was sent by a military personnel serving with the China Expedition Force during the Opium War of 1840. The latest recorded letter is dated 26 March 1844, letter no. 62 of the Edwards correspondence addressed to Weston Super Mare, England.

The Hong Kong Post Office Royal Arms cachet was replaced by the short-lived Victoria Crown Hong Kong cachet (Webb type 5) followed by the 'Paid at Hong Kong' and 'Hong Kong' broken-ring datestamp in 1844 (Webb type 6 & 7).

Half a century after publication of Webb⁴, the number of examples of the Hong Kong Royal Arms jumped from twenty to seventy-four⁵. No doubt, more examples will surface in the near future, as more and more letters from yet unknown correspondence during the 1842 to 1844 period come into the market.
